Melbourne, renowned for its vibrant culture and world-class connectivity, offers an ideal setting for this event, which serves as a unique platform to explore the latest technological advancements, policy developments, and operational strategies shaping the future of transportation systems globally.

This year's ISFO will also incorporate the annual ITS Australia Roads, Tolling & Tech conference, enriching the program and providing attendees with enhanced
